As you read this, I will likely be at the LCMC (Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ) Annual Gathering. It runs from Sunday evening September 29th though Wednesday morning, October 2nd. This year it is in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. LCMC is the association to which Peace belongs. Founded in 2001 with 25 congregations, it has grown to close to 1,000 congregations worldwide. While we are in countries around the world, we are heavily represented in the Midwest and West Coast (essentially, where Lutheran immigrants from Europe settled).

While LCMC doesn't affect the day-to-day workings of Peace Lutheran Church, there is something powerful about being a part of something bigger. When I go to these gatherings, I connect with pastors and lay leaders I've known for over 25 years. For example, Lutheran Church of Hope, in West Des Moines, Iowa, was my internship site and is now a member of LCMC. With around 10,000 people attending each weekend, it is easily the largest Lutheran church in the country.

From big to small, urban to suburban to rural, old established churches to new mission starts, LCMC has a diverse mix of churches which are a part of it.

As I attend the gathering, it occurs to me that I'll experience something similar to what we experience on Sundays: part reunion with friends and family, part learning and growing, and part praising God. It's good to come alongside other people to worship and celebrate!
