## **...our Council President and Pastor**

I recently taught the Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25:14-30) to the confirmation students. Afterward I was talking to another teacher about the lesson and they were wondering if the meaning of the lesson was that the rich get richer and the poor get poorer.

I interpret the parable to be about one's faith. God has given each of us much: our lives, our possessions, our livelihoods, our families. He has also given us our faith and the Holy Spirit. What will you do with your faith? Will you invest it in the community? Will you bury it and hide it from others?

At Peace, we are trying to update the way we worship, sharing our faith, and trying to be more inviting to the community. I have heard from a few members that they do not want Peace to change. They don't want new ideas and music added into worship. They want "their" church to remain small and intimate.

I ask you, "Whose church is Peace?" I believe that the church is God's. The bride of Christ. Should we aspire to bury it so as not to anger God? How did this approach work in the parable?

I pray daily for Peace. I ask God to watch over all who work and worship here. I ask for God's guidance and discernment. I ask God to reveal the direction and path that He wants of us. The answer that popped into my head was Matthew 28:19: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations." We are to grow God's church - not to get more people in the seats - but to bring more people to Christ.

I think of 1 Corinthians 9:19-23. We are trying to be all things to all people. Jew or gentile, lawful or lawless, weak or strong, new music or old music. "I do all this because of the good news. And I want to share in its blessings."

So, I ask you, is this your church or God's church? Are you focusing on what makes you comfortable or what makes others feel encouraged and welcomed? Are we living out the great commission at Peace? Are you living out the great commission in your life? Sometimes this takes doing things differently than what makes us comfortable. Where would we be if we were not given the crumbs that fell off the table in Matthew 15:26-28?

Peace, Peder

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On March 9<sup>th</sup>, we will begin a new sermon series looking at "Prayers of the Bible." During the lead up to Easter, we will look at the different ways we pray scripturally and what it means for us.

Prayer is direct to God, without a mediator or middleman, because of what Christ did for us. We don't go to a Temple to make sacrifices or consult a priest to speak with God. Paul tells us *"<sup>5</sup>For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus..."* (1 Timothy 2:5)

Being 100% God and 100% man, Jesus is the mediator. We go directly to God when we pray in the name of Jesus.

My challenge for you, as we lead up to this series, is to examine your prayer life. A healthy prayer life will include the Lord's Prayer (since Jesus told us to pray it), and it will include simple, spontaneous prayers as the Spirit leads us to pray. After all: *"<sup>26</sup>Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words."* (Romans 8:26)

Some people find that it helps to have scheduled devotional time. Others pray "without ceasing" throughout the day as they ask God to guide them as they encounter various situations and people. The key thing is to intentionally seek God in prayer and seek to listen to the Spirit as He guides you.

I'm looking forward to exploring these various passages with you!
