We have spent the last few weeks going through our sermon series called "Prayers of the Bible," and this series will take us up to Holy Week. I hope you've been challenged to consider your own prayer life and how the different forms and words of prayer in the Bible can affect or influence it.

One of the most obvious examples is the Lord's Prayer, which we are covering on March 30th. As Lutherans, we are typically good about incorporating this into our prayer life in worship and individually.

I encourage you to think about the other examples. What if you incorporated Psalm 51 into your prayer life once a week? You could quite easily make that your prayer of confession. Remember how it starts:

51 Have mercy on me, O God,
according to your steadfast love;
according to your abundant mercy
blot out my transgressions.

2 Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity,
and cleanse me from my sin!

We have such a rich library of prayers in Scripture. While much of prayer is "free prayer" as the Spirit leads you, you have access to words given by the Holy Spirit giving you a pattern for "how" to pray when the words aren't coming!

BOARD of EDUCATION March 10, 2025

The Church Board of Education meeting was called to order with Nicole, Alex, and Laurie in attendance.

The Sunday School Director's report highlighted the need for volunteers for the end-of-year celebration and bake sale. Laurie will handle the Pond Pick-up activity, Nicole will oversee the Fish, Wolf, and Bear activity, and Alex will lead the Northern Lights Painting activity. A volunteer is still needed for the Magnetic Poles activity. The board also welcomed Alex Roy as a new member. Teacher assignments for the 2025-2026 school year are still being finalized, with some teachers switching grades and substitute teacher outreach still in progress.

For Family Ministries, the upcoming mission focuses were outlined: March's mission will support California Fire relief through the Salvation Army, April's mission will assist elderly care facilities, May's mission will support THUG Life Ministries, and June's mission will contribute to UNITED Fire and Rescue. Updates are pending for the latter two missions. (We also talked about changing the missions if needed to include a craft/VBS supplies drive!)

Preparations for the Palm Sunday Bake Sale on April 13th are underway. Missi is printing labels with VBS registration QR codes to attach to baked goods. Laurie will manage setup, while Laurie and Nicole will work between services, and Laurie will handle cleanup. (Nicole will help with setting up or cleaning up depending on childcare.)

The End-of-Year (EOY) Program is structured to include a time for kids to sing, followed by memorization and awards. Students will then rotate through activity stations, which will ideally be held outdoors. Additionally, a volunteer is needed to help hand out awards. Snacks will be available near the front door for attendees to grab as they leave.

Vacation Bible School (VBS) planning continues, with Laura providing access to previously purchased music and action videos. The kids will learn at least one song for the EOY program, and discussion continues regarding how many songs should be included throughout the week. The board has approved a Thursday night program where children will sing at least two songs with actions and display an art gallery featuring their projects from the week. The tentative schedule includes dinner at 5:00 PM, followed by music and a Bible story, then crafts, games, and closing prayers.

Additional updates include confirmation that palms have been ordered and memorization activities have begun. The SOLA curriculum will be ordered in late April or early May to allow time for assembling binders. Future discussions on the VBS curriculum will consider purchasing additional activity supplies and a banner, though posters are already available. A comprehensive list of needed materials will be reviewed at the April meeting.

The next Church Board of Education meeting is scheduled for Monday, April 14th at 6:30 PM.
